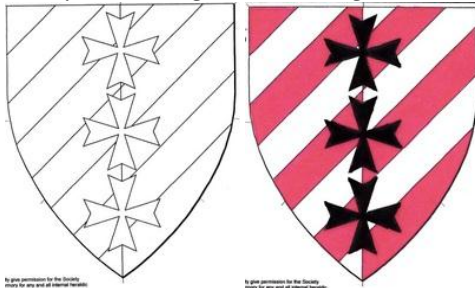
(The Cover Letter of the March 2004 LoAR has "award unto Mari, Zenobia, and Daniel, the rank of Herald Extraordinary". While it doesn't provide a surname to identify which Daniel it is, the fifth paragraph up thanks Mari Elspeth nic Bryan, Zenobia Naphtali, and Daniel de Lincoln, and Zenobia Naphtali made a similar inference to support her registration of Black Stag H.E. on the June 2005 LoAR.

RfS 111.2 says that place-names may be used as heraldic titles.)

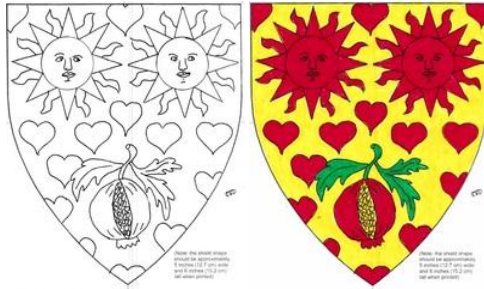

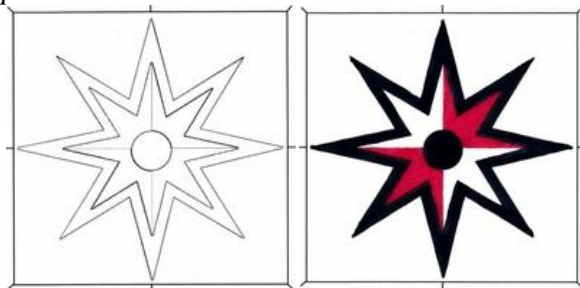

While a minority of submitters felt this should be returned for violation of RfS IX.1, that is a call for Wreath to make.

(fieldless) On a mullet of eight points sable a mullet of eight points quarterly argent and gules pierced.

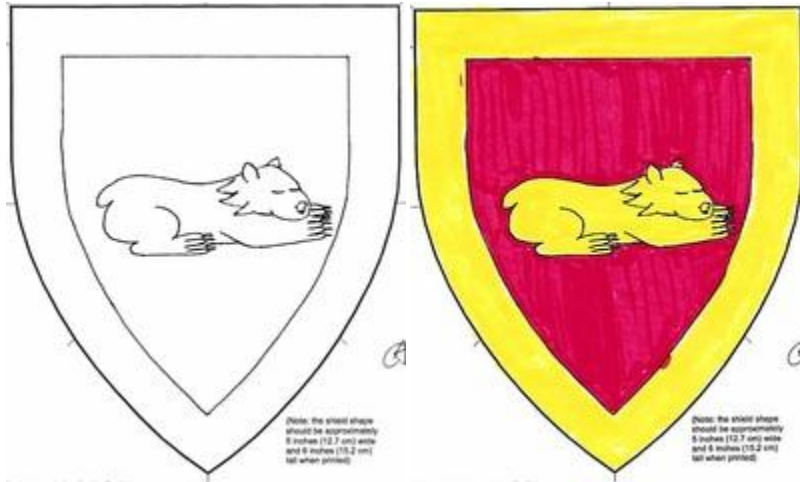


Submission History: Name and device ILoI 6/11 19

This was submitted as a rowel of eight points, but the commenters were unable to find any evidence that a rowel has any number of points beside six. We have re-blazoned this as a mullet of eight points pierced.

Uillecc Dubh mac Uilicc (Steppes, Barony of) New Device.

Gules, a bear dormant to sinister within a bordure Or.



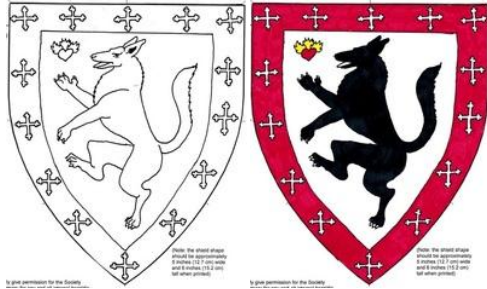
Consultation Table: Pennsic

Returned for further work

Elyssa de Orozco (Mooneschadowe, Province of) New Device.

Argent, a wolf rampant sable maintaining a heart enflamed gules within a bordure gules crusily bottony argent.



Submission History: This name was registered in January of 2002 (via Ansteorra)

This submission is returned for violation of RfS VIII.3.

The heart is not drawn large enough to be identified as a heart. Many commenters had problems identifying it. The submitter is encouraged to draw the heart larger. Also, while not a return issue, the heart was blazoned as maintained. A maintained charge is held by the charge maintaining so it must touch. If the submitter intended the heart to be maintained, then the wolf needs to touch it. If not, then it is not maintained.

The second issue is the crosses on the bordure, as drawn it is difficult to identify the type of cross. It is suggested that the submitter draw the crosses a bit thicker.
