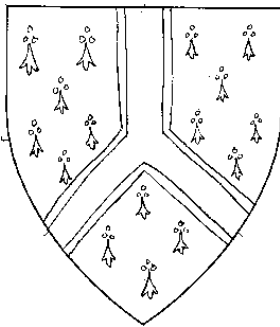


1) **Ariella Christine D'Aillé (Bryn Gwlad)**
New device. Name registered 04/94.

Averay, Hugo filius Auveray from 1275.

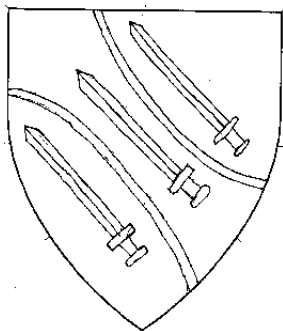

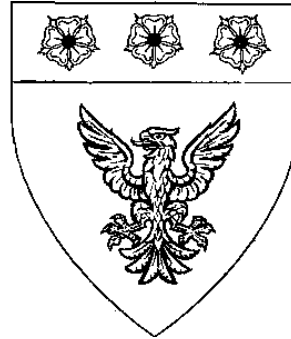

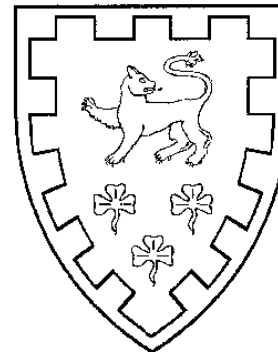

la Combe: French surname. Reaney and Wilson, pg. 106, s.n. Combe gives Alan in la Combe from 1269. Dautat, Noms de famille, pg. 142, s.n. Combe lists Lacombe as a variant.

7) Damasca Gisele de Bier (Gate's Edge)

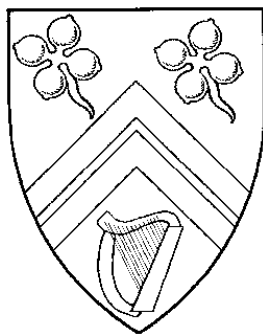
De Bier: French locative byname. Dautat, Noms de Lieux, pg. 68, s.n. Beire-le-Chatel gives Bere from 1232 and Bieres from 1259-1312.

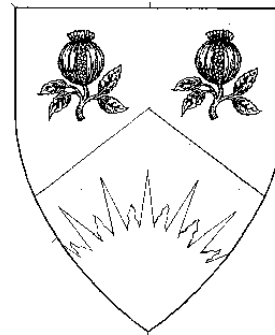

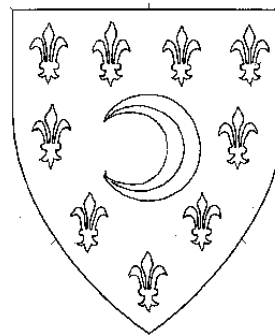

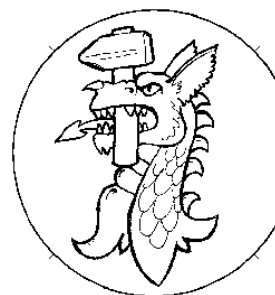

11) Godwin Alfricson (Bjornsborg)

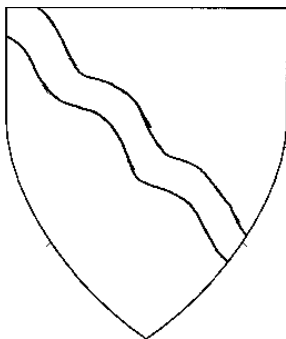

von Kalden: German locative byname. Bahlow, Dictionary of German Names, Edda Gentry translation, pg. 283, s.n. Kalden shows it to be a location northeast of Kassel.

14) Joseph MacClennon (Bordermarch)

Joseph: English Masculine given name. Reaney and Wilson, pg. 257, s.n. Joseph gives Joseph as a given name from 1141 and 1187.

MacClennon: Gaelic byname. Black, pg. 537 s.n. MacClennan gives John M'Clynnyne from 1529 and Adam M'Clenane from 1586.

Photocopies: None needed.

Changes: Any. Language/culture is most important. Desired gender is male. Changes

requested for authenticity to 15th Century Scottish.

15) Muirenn ingen Senán ui Dunlainghe (Dragonsfire Tor)

New name.

Documentation provided:

Muirenn: Gaelic Feminine given name. O Corrain + Maguire, pg. 141, s.n. Muireen dates it to 831.

ingen: Gaelic particle.

Senán: Gaelic Masculine given name. O Corrain + Maguire, pg. 164, s.n. Senán shows it as an early period name from Clare.

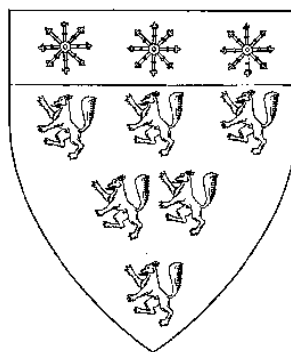
ui Dunlainghe: Gaelic byname. Woulfe, pg. 519, s.n. O Dúnlaing gives it as descendant of Dúnlang, an ancient personal name.

16) Muriella de Claire (Elfsea)

New name. New device.



Argent, six wolves rampant, three, two and one and on a chief azure three escarbuncles argent.

Documentation provided:

Muriella: English Feminine given name. Withycombe, pg. 224, s.n. Muriel shows as Muriella as a given name dated to 1199 and 1285.

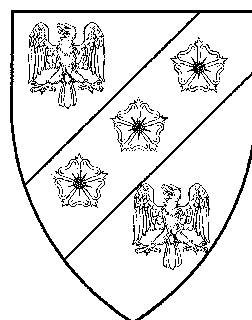
de Claire: English locative byname. Reaney and Wilson, pg. 98, s.n. Clare shows Richard Clare dated to 1317, and Richard de Clara dated to 1086.

Photocopies: None needed.

Changes: Any. Sound is most important. Desired gender is female.

17) Robert Michael McPharlan (Stargate)

Change of primary name. New device.



Or, on a bend sinister between two eagles displayed wings inverted sable, three roses Or.

Change of primary name from Haroun ibn Khalid abd ar-Rahman reg. 09/92 via Ansteorra. If Robert Michael McPharlan is registered, release old name.

Documentation provided:

Robert: English

Masculine given name. Reaney and Wilson, pg. 380, s.n. Robert gives Robert as a given name from 1066 from the Domesday Book.

Michael: English Masculine given name.

Withycombe, pg. 219, s.n. Michael dates it as a given name from 1196-1215, 1218, 1303, and 1346.

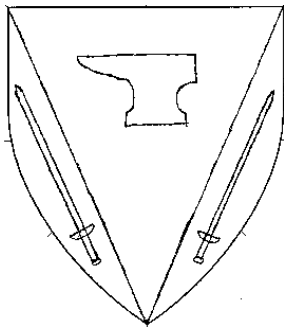
McPharlan: Gaelic byname. Reaney and Wilson, pg. 291, s.n. MacFarlan dates Malcolm McPharlane to 1385.

Changes: Any. Desired gender is male.

18) Seanán mac Tighearnán (Dragonsfire Tor)

New name. New device.



Sable, on a pile Or an anvil sable, between two swords in pile argent.

Documentation provided:

Seanán: Gaelic Masculine given name. O Corrain + Maguire, pg. 164,

s.n. Senán gives Seanán as an early period name in Clare.

mac: Gaelic particle.

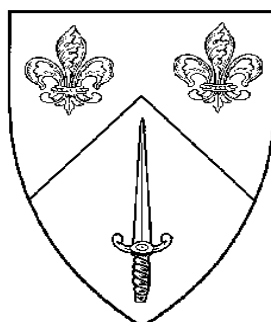
Tighearnán: Gaelic byname. O Corrain + Maguire, pg. 170, s.n. Tigernán gives Tighearnán dates it to 10th century and 1127-1172.

Photocopies: None needed.

Changes: Minor changes only. Irish language/culture is most important. Desired gender is male. Changes requested for authenticity to 11th century.

19) Sibri de Aldebourne (Elfsea)

New name. New device.



Per chevron purpure and sable, two fleurs-de-lys and a sword Or.

Documentation provided:

Sibri: English Feminine given name derived from matronymic shown by Reaney and Wilson, pg. 397, s.n. Seaber as Alan Sibri dated to 1276.

de Aldebourne: English locative byname dated in this spelling to 1380 in Oxfordshire as found in "English Names from Pre-1600's Brass Inscriptions" (1996, Julian Goodwyn (Janell K. Lovelace)) at www.sca.org/heraldry/laurel/names/brasses/lastnameCD.html#D.

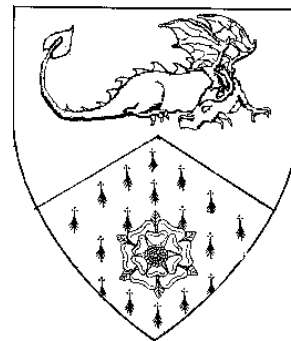

Per chevron purpure and ermine, a dragon dormant contourny argent and a six-petalled rose purpure, barbed vert, charged with another argent, seeded Or.



21) William Worm (Elfsea)

Resubmitted device. Name registered 04/99.



Gules, a monk's hood Or.

Submission history:

Kingdom returned: ILoI 10/98 William Worm (Eldern Hills) *Quarterly gules and barry bendy azure and argent, in bend a hood and a bell Or.* The

arms violate RfS XI.3.b: Marshalling.

Kingdom returned: ILoI 04/00 William Worm (Elfsea) Resubmitted device. *Quarterly wavy gules and barry bendy azure and argent, in bend two hoods Or* because the barry-bendy quarters made the complex line of division unidentifiable.

22) Xenos the Butcher (Northkeep)

New name

Documentation provided:

From *Peasant Society in the late Byzantine Empire* by Angeliki Laiou-Thomdakis:

Xenos: Byzantine Masculine given name. Pg. 109 Xenos dated to 14th century.

Butcher: Occupational byname. Pg. 120 shows profession name dating from the 14th century.

Changes: Any. Sound [Byzantine/Greek] is most important. Desired gender is male.
