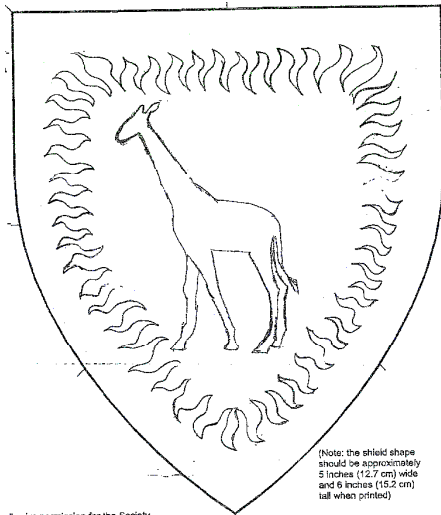


1) **Adena Terricksdotter. (Namron)**

Submission History: Name: Returned for insufficient documentation/cultural weirdness.

Device: Azure, a camelleopard *Or, an orle of flames proper*, returned for redraw. The flames are not in orle, since they do not follow the shape of the shield, nor truly in annulo. Furthermore, they are not depicted in an acceptable form.

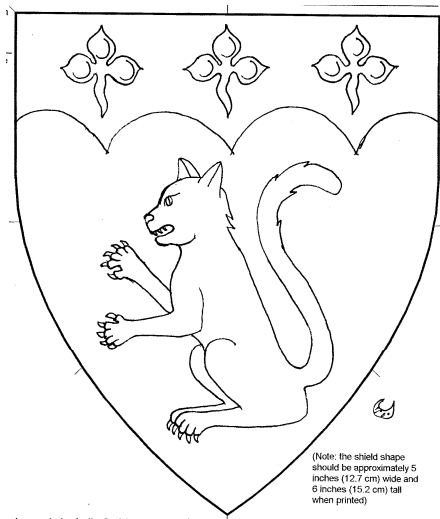
Azure, in pale three mullets of four points, two and one, and a tower, all within a double tressure Or.

Per ben grady, Or and Gules, in sinister chief a martlet sable.

Submission History: *Per bend battled embattled gules and Or a martlet sable.* Returned for redraw. The color is now a nice brown, not heraldic red, and the entire form (a printout of a scan of a color print) has faded already. The submission must be on the standard submission form, without changing the shield shape or size. Correct blazon would be “Per bend embattled grady Or and gules, a martlet sable.” Also note that the line of division must start in the exact corner.
