Collated Commentary on ILoI 0301

1. Lowrens of Ross (?)

Name registered 09/00 via Ansteorra. Argent, on a Pall Vert, A Lion Rampant Or, Langued Azure, three Crosses Crosslet Gules.

Da'ud

[Device] The usual grammar of blazon places the charges lying directly on the shield (except for peripheral charges like bordures and chiefs, etc.) before tertiary charges. Lions are "rampant" by default, so that word can safely be dropped from the blazon. "With regard to small details on animals, such as claws and teeth, these really shouldn't clutter up the blazon unless really necessary. ... Rather than clutter up the blazon it is much better to just use the space for notes to the scribe or

artist on the picture sheet to detail just how to color the small details. Large details, such as a horse's mane, should be described in the blazon." (Wilhelm von Schlüssel, Cover Letter 18 March 1980, p. 1)

Blazon fu: Argent, on a pall vert between three crosses crosslet gules, a lion Or.

Northkeep

[Device] Reblazon: Argent, on a pall vert, between three crosses crosslet gules, a lion rampant Or langued azure. We are not convinced that the tongue is a significant enough detail to warrant blazoning but will ask the decision meeting to check the full color emblazon. Appears clear of conflict.

Emma

[Device] Argent, on a Pall Vert, A Lion Rampant Or, Langued Azure, three Crosses Crosslet Gules. Blazon Fu: Argent, on a pall vert between three crosses crosslet gules a lion rampant Or langued azure.

This device, which looks so simple in black and white, has a complexity count of 7: Argent, vert, Or, gules, pall, lion, crosses - It is "colorful", and while the complexity count is not in excess of the allowable, I would have encouraged the submitter to limit the number of tinctures. It complicates an otherwise elegantly simple design. I am also concerned about the azure languing. On my coloring of the device it does not show well against the vert background. I am guessing that the blue tongue is important to the submitter for some reason. It does not count against complexity but again IMO "clutters" an otherwise beautiful device. I found no conflicts.

[Device] I think this should read "Argent, on a pall vert between three crosses crosslet gules, a lion rampant Or, langued gules." No conflicts.

College Action

Device: Incorrectly blazoned on ILoI. Pended until April ILoI for correction.

2. Euric von dem Älterburg (Eldern Hills)

New name.

Da'ud

[Name] It is not possible to simply translate an SCA group name into another language and have it automatically acceptable. Is Älterburg an actual placename in the dictionary cited, or is he simply translating the two parts (eldern + hills) into German? If the former, then we need to make sure that the particles are grammatically correct. If the latter, then we need documentation that the entire locative byname is not only grammatically correct but follows documented naming practices in German.

"Names of registered extant SCA groups are only automatically registerable in the language in which they are actually registered." (Jaelle of Armida, LoAR July 1997, p. 15) "The byname is Mongolian for *Thousand Eyes*, which is also the name of the submitter's Barony. Normally we do not register

translations of SCA group names. However, the submitter has provided documentation that this follows period Mongolian practice Since the byname follows documented Mongolian practice it is acceptable." (Jaelle of Armida, LoAR July 1997, p. 7)

Gawain

[Name] It's so easy for me to get "Burg" and "Berg" mixed up, even after a year and a half of German. The former means "castle", while it's the latter that means "mountain". If he wants to be "of the elder mountains", he needs to use the plural form as well: "von den Älterberge". (Don't think the conjoined adjective would change to plural.) I note that my dictionary gives the first definition of "Berg" as "mountain", with "hill" second, while "Hügel" is glossed as "hill". Have no idea which would be the more normal usage. If the latter is chosen, note that the plural is the same as the singular, so "von den Älterhügel" would be the correct grammar.

Northkeep

[Name] Appears clear of conflict. Etienne went looking through the precedents online as he thought there was one against translating SCA group names into other languages. Whether such a precedent exists or not, the question for this submission is whether the form "Eldern Hills" or "Ancient Hills" would be appropriate in a period Germanic language. We feel unable to answer that.

The Gazette did not list the referenced Saint Gabriel documentation so we did a little searching. While we came up with about a half-dozen St. Gabriel letters which referenced "Euric", the most complete may be letter 2155 from which we partially quote:

"<Euric> is an early name most likely arising from the root elements <Eber-> and <-ric>. It is important for you to know that the letter <u> in <Euric> is a scribal equivalent for <v>; the same name is also recorded as <Evricus> and <Evericus>. [1] It was pronounced \EHV-rik\ or \AYV-rik\. We find forms of the name recorded as late as 1050, but not after; further, the instances of this name are Romanized Frankish, which would not be appropriate for use in Germany. [2],"

- [2] When people who spoke a language descended from Latin (e. g., Old French) borrowed or continued to use names of Germanic origin, these names underwent various sound changes according to the local Romance (= Latin-descended) dialect. The citations we found show signs of having undergone these changes. In most of Germany you don't see these kinds of changes, because there was no significant population speaking a Romance dialect.

Emma

[Name] I do not currently have my name reference books available, so the only comment I can make is (1) I would like to see dates with these submissions. Consulting heralds need to re-

mind their clients that even though the reference is a "no photocopy required" book, the dates are important. As we all know, there are names in such notable resources as Black and Reaney & Wilson, as headers which are not dated to period.

Bryn Gwlad

[Name] "Euric"—In the aforementioned Gregory on p. 376, there is a passage which reads "In the same year, his relation Aedica, who was married to his sister, led an army against Euric". "Älterburg—This appears to be Germanic for "elder town", which may exist as "Altenberg" today, but this does not match the intended meaning of the submitter. Our "German-English" dictionary indicates that the equivalent of "hill" in High German would be "Hügel". Our best guess, given our limited expertise, would be to change the byname locative to "von dem Ältenhügel". Sure enough, Bahlow (Eddy) on p. 273 gives "hüg" and lists "Hüglin Haffner", Kirchheimin Würt, 1406. Further, there is a "Hügel(Mann)", meaning "From the dwelling place at/on the hill", so "Ältenhügel" is plausible. However, we'd like to have Laurel make the judgement call on this.

College Action

Name: Returned. No evidence given for "Älterburg" as a valid placename; see also the Jaelle precedent quoted by Da'ud.

3. Áine Fion (Eldern Hills)

New name.

Da'ud

[Name] The Administrative Handbook requires that "A summary of all supporting evidence provided for the submission must be included on the letter of intent." A bald citation to a source is in no way a "summary" of the documentation. What do the sources say about the various name elements? What do the two elements mean? Are they both given names? If so, we have a returnable problem with the submission. "To the best of our knowledge, the Gaelic-speaking cultures do not seem to have used double given names." (Jaelle of Armida, LoAR August 1997, p. 5) "No evidence has been found for double given names in Gaelic." (Elsbeth Anne Roth, LoAR July 2001, p. 10)

Northkeep

[Name] The first name appears fine. We are unsure of the documentation for the second name. We do not have OC&M to see if it was referenced from there.

Emma

[Name] I do not currently have my name reference books available, so the only comment I can make is (1) I would like to see dates with these submissions. Consulting heralds need to remind their clients that even though the reference is a "no photocopy required" book, the dates are important. As we all know, there are names in such notable resources as Black and Reaney & Wilson, as headers which are not dated to period.

Bryn Gwlad

[Name] "A'ine"—O & M p. 19 shows "A'ine", meaning "Radiance or splendor". This occurred among the Ciarraigh and other peoples. This name was obsolete for males, but retained its popularity among females. "Fion"—O & M p. 100 shows "Fion", meaning "fair, bright, white, light-hued". In the later Middle Ages, its use was retained among the "Dempseys" and "Driscolls".

Name: Forwarded to Laurel.

LAUREL ACCEPTANCES AND RETURNS FOR DECEMBER 2002

The following are the Ansteorran excerpts from the Laurel December 2002 letter on published Feb 27, 2003.

Aicelina de Carcassona, Name.

Alienor Lewelyne. Device. Vert, a cross barby Or and overall a rabbit sejant contourny argent.

Doireann inghean uí Brolcháin. Device. Per pale sable and vert, a hedgehog statant and a bordure embattled argent.

Elizabeth Hawkwood. Name.

Ernin ap Iago. Name.

Gabrielle de Luxton. Name and device. Per bend sable and gules, two fleurs-de-lys Or.

Gassion de Beaumarchais. Name.

The submitter requested authenticity for the 15th C. As we were unable to find a 15th C form of *Beaumarchais*, we were unable to confirm that this name is authentic for the submitter's requested time period.

Iosbail inghean Ghilla Chríost. Device. Argent, a frog vert within a bordure gyronny Or and purpure.

John de Irwyne. Badge. (Fieldless) A holly branch bendwise vert fructed gules.

Katherine Brandon. Name and device. Erminois, a lion gules and a chief dovetailed azure.

Krag MacYntier. Name.

Combining Scots and Danish in a name is registerable, though this combination carries a weirdness.

Lisette la Vinhala. Name.

Lyn the Inquisitive. Device. Azure, a dog sejant guardant argent spotted sable within a bordure argent lozengy sable.

Many commenters noted the similarity of this emblazon to the Dalmatian breed of dog, and questioned whether that breed was period. Clarion stated:

Dalmatians are probably a period breed, there is a mention of spotted dogs in an Elizabethan Journal (National Geographic Book of Dogs). As the shape of the dog resembles a Dalmatian, we might as well use it. I would still give its color as *argent spotted sable*, especially as modern Dalmatians can have brown spots as well.

This is sufficient evidence to allow this sort of depiction of a dog in SCA heraldry, as the type of dog is compatible with period types of dog. Because the submitter originally blazoned this dog simply as a dog argent spotted sable rather than a Dalmatian argent spotted sable we will continue to blazon it as a dog.

Lyn the Inquisitive. Badge. Azure, a maiden argent crined Or within a bordure argent lozengy sable.

Marcus the Quiet. Device. Per bend sable and gules, an open scroll and a musical note Or.

Phoebe Hotham. Name and device. Per chevron Or and sable, a chevron azure and in base a crescent argent, a chief invected sable mullety argent.

Phoebe Hotham. Badge. Or, on a roundel per fess azure and sable a crescent argent all within a bordure invected sable mullety argent.

Rafe Slater. Name and device. Azure, on a bend raguly cotised plain argent three ravens palewise rising wings addorsed sable.

Sabin Slater. Name and device. Per chevron sable and vert, a chevron Or between two roses argent and a fox's mask Or.

Uilliam Farquharson. Name.

Submitted as *Uilleam Farquharson*, *Uilleam* was documented as a modern Scottish Gaelic form of *William*. No evidence was found that this is a period form. We have changed this name to the documented period Gaelic form *Uilliam* in order to register this name.

Winther der Trüwe. Name.

THE FOLLOWING HAVE BEEN RETURNED FOR FURTHER WORK

Bub of the Steppes. Name.

No documentation could be found for *Bub* as a given name. The documentation that the submitter presented from Searle (p. 119) showed *Bub* as a protheme, not as an independent given name. Names that Searle lists (p. 119) that include the protheme *Bub*- include *Bubba*, *Bubbo*, and *Bubo*. Lacking evidence of *Bub* as a given name, it is not registerable.

It was generally felt at the decision meeting that the change from *Bub* (which the submitter had believed was an independent name) to either *Bubba* or *Bubbo* was a major change, which the submitter did not allow.

THE FOLLOWING HAVE BEEN PENDED UNTIL THE JUNE 2003 LAUREL MEETING

Emma de Fetherstan. Device change. Quarterly per fess indented argent and gules.

This submission is being pended for consideration of whether the SCA should un-protect one of the versions of the Panama flag which are currently registered in the Armorial and Ordinary, that being, *Quarterly 1 and 4 argent, 2 gules, and 3 azure.* This version was protected in the original "National Flags to be added to the SCA A and O" list sent out with the September 1995 LoAR. The current flag of Panama, *Quarterly first and fourth argent, second*

gules and third azure, in bend a mullet azure and another gules was protected in November 1999. Without evidence that the 1995 registration was a national flag of Panama (or elsewhere) at some point in time, it will be un-protected.

A number of vexillogical sources discuss the flag of Panama and its history, and the 1995 version is not mentioned as a one-time national flag in any of these sources. Sources checked included the Flags of the World web site (http://www.efb.ch/flags/flags/pa. html), Flags of the World (ed. H. Gresham Carr), Flags (by Whitney Smith), and Webster's Concise Encyclopedia of Flags and Coats of Arms (ed. William G. Crampton). We are fortunate to have many of the persons involved in the initial 1995 protection list still active in the College, and perhaps they can shed some light on this question.

If the 1995 registration is found to require continued protection in the SCA, then this submission will conflict with it. There is one CD for indenting the per fess line, but no other difference for changing only one-quarter of the tinctures on the field.

The submitter has requested that, should this armory be accepted, her previous device, *Argent masoned sable, a feather bendwise sinister gules*, should be released.

This does not conflict with Ulf of Sjaelland, *Quarterly gules and argent.* RfS X.4.a Field Difference states "There is a clear difference for reversing the tinctures of a field evenly divided into two parts, per saltire, or quarterly." So, per RfS X.4. a.ii.c ("Other Field-Primary Armory"), there's one CD for changing the order of the tinctures of the quarterly field and a second CD for indenting the per fess line.
